

on a piece of soft wood, Pine works well slather some gorilla Glue in the hole use a small piece of wood to thoroughly coat the inside of the hole then dip the tang in some water, (this is the reason for the ridges in the tang to hold water which is the catalyst for the glue) Use a scrap piece of wood and pat the handle down on the tool, If you use gorilla glue either clamp it in place or check it every few minutes because the glue will try and force the tool out of the hole as it expands, Epoxy will work as well and isn't as messy in the long run, and from reports will hold as well as the Polyurethane glues with less mess.

Now get out there and make some saw dust and wood chips
